### Brown Is One Of The Lucky Ones

Statistics regarding orphaned children in Russia are quite disturbing. More than 250,000 children are residents of the state orphanage system with more 650,000 in some other form of state care. The Russian orphanages are often overcrowded, understaffed and generally neglectful. Some of these infants and children are adopted by non-Russian families, primarily in the United States. When it comes to disabled children, the story is even sadder. If a disabled child cannot be adopted by age eight, he or she is often sent to a sanatorium to live with other society castoffs such as the elderly or mentally retarded. The future holds little for these children.

New Horizons is a twice-a-year hosting program that travels to the United States with 20 to 40 children, ages four and up, from Russia and Latvia. These children get a first-hand glimpse of a loving family life and will hopefully be adopted into their forever family. This is the story of Elizaveta Brown, a Russian orphan with cerebral palsy, who was adopted locally when she was part of the New Horizons program in January of 2009. Kat and Jerry Brown already had three children, Timothy, 18, Christopher 15 and Stephen, 12. They live in Warner Robins where Kat is a substitute teacher and Jerry is retired from the Air Force. In

January 2009, a fellow teacher e-mailed Kat an article about New Horizons, and she was intrigued by this one little 7-year-old girl Elizaveta. After discussing the situation with the whole family, they decided to meet Elizaveta, and from there they all fell in love with her. After several meetings and a lengthy adoption process, Elizaveta became one of the family and was brought to America in November, 2009. In an effort to get Elizaveta acclimated to some of the ways of American culture, they took her bowling. Even with her disabilities, this was one sport she could perform. She could use a ramp to place the ball and then push it toward the lane with the ball ultimately rolling into the pins. The first time Elizaveta tried it she became so excited that she told her adopted family "Me Do" in what little English she knew. From here the bowling story is one of success. She joined a youth league at the Gold Cup Center in Warner Robins with her brother Stephen. She has become very adroit at moving the ramp to not only get strikes but pick up spares, as well. So well, that in the Pepsi Challenge she placed first in her singles category and with her brother Stephen she placed first in the doubles category in the city youth tournament. Things are still tough for orphans in Russia today, but here is one little girl who has beat the odds and has become integrated successfully into American society where she will be an ordinary third grader in Quail Run Elementary School in Warner Robins in the upcoming year.

Destiny Harper at the age of 16 has rolled her first record setting series by a youth female in the state of GA for 800 Series at AMF American Lanes on 10/22/11. Her games were 279 – 258 – 268 to total **805** Scratch Series. She rolled her first 300 Game in 2009 at the age of 14, also at Conyers. Destiny is currently a Junior in High School and is carrying a 217 Average at AMF American

Lanes in Conyers Georgia.

This past July she finished 36<sup>th</sup> in the 2011 National Junior Gold Tournament held in Las Vegas. She won the Scratch Division 2011 Pepsi Tournament held in Columbus. At Warner Robins State Youth Tournament she Placed 1<sup>st</sup> in Singles & in All Events. She has competed in several local Tournaments, won multiple City & State Superlative Awards. Won the Georgia Youth Bowlers Tour Tournament Of Champions twice. Bowled on the Georgia Interstate All Stars for 5 Years. An active Member of the Bowlers Of Distinction Club, she also serves as a Member on the Greater Atlanta Youth Community & Georgia State Youth Leaders.
